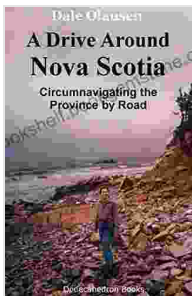

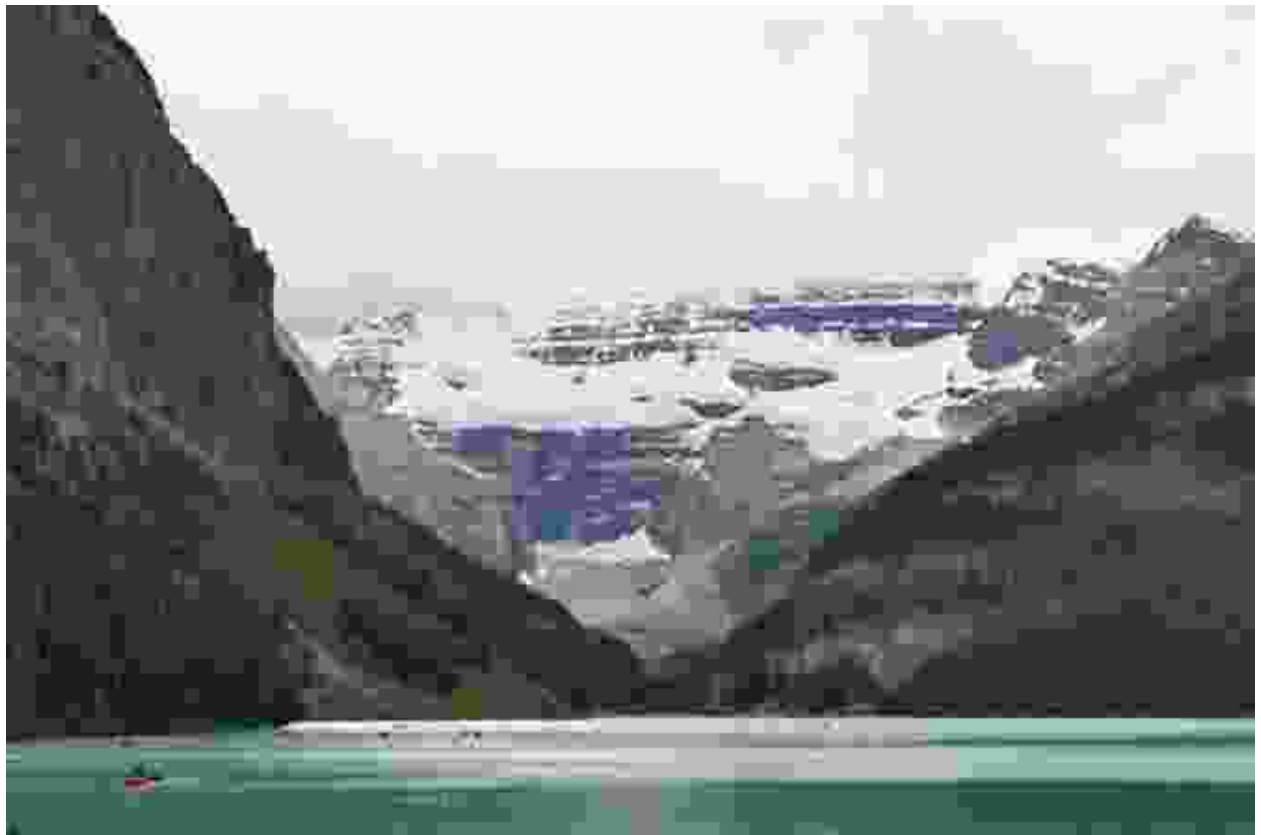

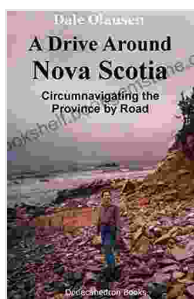


Tips for an Unforgettable Road Trip

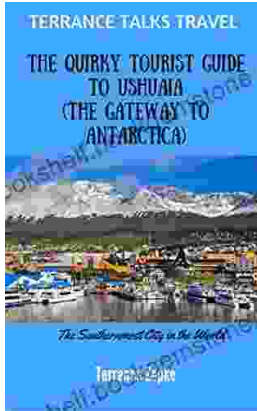

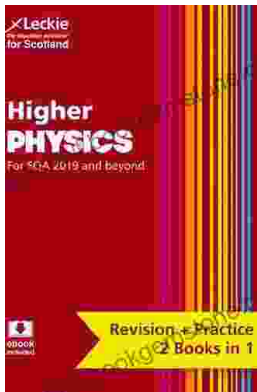
