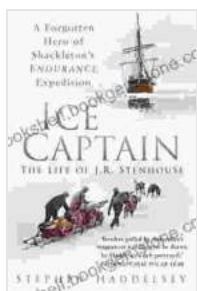


Forgotten Heroes of the Shackleton Endurance Expedition

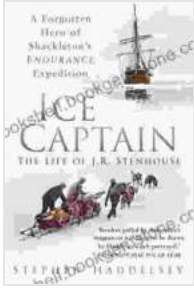
The Forgotten Heroes

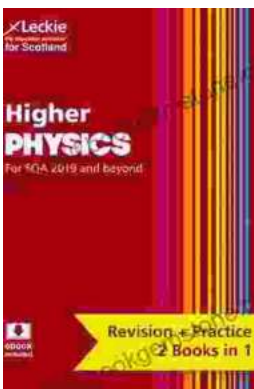
