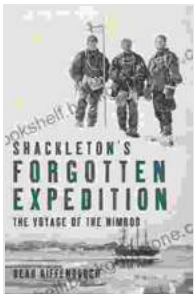

Shackleton began planning the Endurance Expedition in 1914, shortly after his return from his previous expedition to Antarctica. He secured funding from a number of sources, including the British government and private donors. 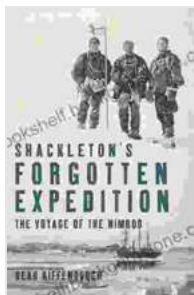
